- Containing inflation and ensuring macroeconomic and financial stability
- Agriculture development and food security
- Climate change and implications of achieving net-zero carbon
- Jobs, skills, and income security in the era of globalization
- Mitigating long-term economic scarring from the pandemic
- Closing gender gaps in income and opportunities
- Approaches to closing digital divides

Interested authors shall register [here](#) to submit papers by **28 February 2023**. Submissions will be evaluated in terms of originality, analytical rigor, and policy relevance in the Asian context. Decisions on paper selection will be released in **March 2023**.
